COMPLETING YOUR CASE

The forms you use to finish your case depend on wheth your spouse filed a Response to your Petition and whether or not you a your spouse into a Marital Settlement Agreement or a Stipulated Judgment.

In this situation, the agreement or stipulation will need to be signed by both parties with both signatures requiring notarization. There are additional fees for notarization. In some counties your spouse may be required to pay a filing fee (check your local representation). Your spouse may be required to serve you with a preliminary Declaration of Disclope and file a Declaration Regarding Service of Preliminary Disclosure (FL141), however, a can both aive service of final Disclosures.

OBTAINING THE FINAL JUDGMENT

Judgment by Declaration: Most uncont declaration without either party appearing h. If y want to get your Judgment approved without making an appearance before the judge dalso file a Declaration for Default or Uncontested Dissolution (form FL-1). If the matter is uncontest of the Petitic is required to sign the Dismissal. If the matter is contested

(Response on file) both parties must sign the request to Dismiss. The court will then dismiss your case. If, at a later date, you decide a divorce is inevity—e, you must file a new Dissolution of Marriage Petition.
